Gift and Sponsorship Policy

The International School Seychelles benefits from the commitment and generosity of national and international benefactors and donors. This continued support allows the school to better fulfil its mission of teaching and preparing students for post-secondary education and for later employment. To administer these donations in an appropriate manner, the school has adopted a donation and fundraising policy.

Through the 'gift and sponsorship Policy' the school seeks to establish and encourage community partnerships which will strengthen and enhance academic and extra-curricular provision; create a strong climate of participation and mutual cooperation between the local community organisations, private individuals and the School; and establish parameters for fundraising and seeking of donations.

The raising funds and seeking donations, the International School Seychelles will be guided by the following fundamental principles:

- The International School Seychelles will encourage sponsorship and donations from businesses and individuals who have both the resources and the inclination to augment educational programs through philanthropy and in line with the Seychelles' CSR tax policy where necessary.
- Fundraising is permitted, within a school context, to allow the International School Seychelles to raise additional funds to augment academic and co-curricular programs and to engage private citizens and community organisations in elevating the education and opportunities of all International School Seychelles students.
- The International School Seychelles is committed to principles of inclusion and will use its facilities, unrestricted gifts and other funds in harmony with these principles.
- The school recognises that fundraising is driven by a donor's inclination for giving and that private donations may be directed by individual donors.
- Whilst reasonable efforts will be made to use donations and fundraising revenues as designated by benefactors, these donations may become revenue of the International School Seychelles and can be used at the discretion of the school to assure that educational opportunities are met.
- Any donation given to an individual is considered a gift and is treated under the gift policy
